Consumer discretionary was the best-performing sector. In corporate news, Saudi Arabian airline Flyadeal canceled an order of Boeing 737 Max jets worth \$6 billion. They opted to go with a competing aircraft from Airbus. Economic news was light as investors await inflation reports and Fed minutes due out later this week. U.S. Treasury prices increased as interest rates decreased.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 116 points or 0.4% to 26,806. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 14 points or 0.5% to 2,976, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 63 points or 0.8% to 8.09.
