### **Obituaries**

- Clifford Elliott, age 91, of Athens, died Thursday at Starr Regional Medical Center of Athens. He was a veteran of World War II and served in the U.S. Army. He was a retired employee of the Federal Bureau of Prisons. Funeral services will be Tuesday at 7 p.m. at Laycock-Hobbs Funeral Home with visitation at 5 p.m.
- Anthony Tyrone "Tony" Henry, age 53, of Athens, died Thursday surrounded by his family and friends. He served in the U.S. Army for several years and had been employed with Collins & Akiman Manufacturing and then later at Heil Trailer Company. A graveside service will be Tuesday at 3:30 p.m. at Hammonds Cemetery with visitation from 2 to 3 p.m. at Companion Funeral Home of Athens.

FRIDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks finished higher, led by the industrials sector. Ford Motor Company and Volkswagen announced that they are expanding their partnership in an effort to develop autonomous and electric vehicles. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 244 points or 0.9% to 27,332. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 13 points or 0.4% to 3,013, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 48 points or 0.6% to 8,244.

#### FORMER POLICE CHIEF INDICTED

Special Agents from the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation have obtained an indictment for former

Tellico Plains police chief, James Russell Parks, Jr., age 44, who's accused of misconduct. On February 14<sup>th</sup>, at the request of 10<sup>th</sup> District Attorney General Steve Crump, TBI Agents began investigating missing funds from the Tellico Plains Police Department's drug enforcement fund, which to-



taled approximately \$840. Agents developed information that Parks was responsible for the missing funds. The investigation further determined that Parks was involved in a sexual relationship with an informant paid out of the department's drug enforcement fund. Parks resigned from the department when the allegation surfaced. Last Tuesday, the Monroe County Grand Jury returned an indictment, charging the Tellico Plains man with one count of Official Misconduct. On Thursday, Agents arrested Parks and booked him into the Monroe County Jail on \$6,000 bond.
