♦ JURY INDICTS WIELZEN

The McMinn County Grand Jury has returned an indictment against Joseph Wielzen for the 2017 murder and rape of 18-year-old Kelsey Burnette in Etowah. The indictment means Wielzen is one step closer to a trial. Even though he was 17 at the time of Miss Burnette's death, he will be tried as an adult. Kelsey Burnette disappeared while on an early morning walk in Etowah in July of 2017. Her body was found a few days later on July 4th. Wielzen was arrested a year later. He is currently being held with no bond at the McMinn County Jail.
