THURSDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks ended the day mixed. The health care and utilities sectors performed well. Initial jobless claims came in lower than expected. Microsoft increased its dividend and announced a new \$40 billion share-repurchase program. Treasury bond prices rose. Interest rates fell. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 52 points or 0.2% to 27,095. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was flat at 3,006, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 5 points or 0.1% to 8,183.
