

Dr. Bass to Speak at TWU

Renowned anthropologist Dr. William Bass will visit Tennessee Wesleyan University this Thursday, November 14th. Dr. Bass will speak at 7:15 p.m. in Townsend Auditorium to share some of his favorite stories. Dr. Bass is known for his work with the "Body Farm" at the University of Tennessee. He has also had a distinguished career working criminal cases and as an author and Professor Emeritus at UT. His appearance at TWU is a fundraiser for the TWU Criminal Justice Club. More History from Joe Guy

The Niota Depot, built in 1854, is the oldest standing railroad depot in Tennessee. Built in what was then known as the Mouse Creek Community, the depot was built to serve the East Tennessee and Georgia Railroad, which had not yet been extended to either Knoxville or Chattanooga.

With the coming of the railroad and the brick depot, Mouse Creek grew into a busting community. Used by both sides during the Civil War, the building still holds the remains of rifle holes in its walls. Graffiti also remains on the interior wooden doors as a record left by soldiers, citizens, and employees that passed through the building for over 100 years.

The depot would go on to be a center point of Niota as the community developed into a manufacturing town, as goods and mail passed across its freight room. The Niota Depot remains a reminder of times and people long gone by.

The McMinn Regional Humane Society has presented Larry Wallace with the first outdoor dog kennel plaque. As a former McMinn County Sheriff and Director of the TBI, he was in the right place to help at the time when humane society members approached him for shelter repair assistance in 2004. He was able to assist the shelter and the city by working out the busing-in of trustees from Brushy Mountain State Penitentiary to build and complete outdoor kennels. The kennel plaque memorializes Sam and Pookie. The plaque hangs at kennel #D20, the very place Wallace found
