Man Impersonates Police Officer

A man has been charged with impersonating a police officer. Athens police say David Dodson, 36, of Calhoun, was arrested on November 12th. Officers were dispatched to the area of Decatur Pike and Dennis Street on a report of a man impersonating a police officer. Upon arrival, a woman told them she was at a red

light when Dodson pulled up next to her in his Dodge truck and blew his horn. Dodson exited the vehicle and walked up to her window, claiming that he was a police officer. Dodson accused the woman of using her cell phone while driving and told her to follow him to the Wal Mart parking lot. Instead, the woman called law enforcement. Officers



located Dodson at the Wal Mart parking lot. He denied that the reported incident happened, but officers found that he had previously been arrested for impersonating a police officer. Officers looked inside his truck and found a siren box, various lights, a security badge, public safety radio channels, and handcuffs. He was arrested for criminal impersonation and booked at the McMinn County Jail.

WIELZEN TRIAL IS UNDER WAY

The trial of Joseph Wielzen enters its third day on Friday. Wielzen is accused of raping and murdering 18-year-old Kelsey Burnette of Etowah in 2017. On Thursday, prosecutors called Austin Burke to the stand. He testified that he, Wielzen, Ms. Burnette, and her boyfriend, Nick Rose, were among a group of friends who hung out together. He said the night of June 30, 2017, they gathered around a campfire where Wielzen, Rose, and Ms. Burnette began drinking. Burke says he went to bed, but some time after midnight Rose woke him up to ask if he knew where Kelsey was. They searched for her but were not able to find her. Burke says the next morning, Wielzen tried to calm everyone down, saying Kelsey was probably at a friend's house. Her body was found 3 days later.
