♦ TODAY IS SUPER TUESDAY PRIMARY

Voters across Tennessee will go to the polls today for Super Tuesday voting. It is the day for the Republican and Democratic presidential preference primary, the county Republican and Democratic primary, and the voters who live in McMinn County (but not in the city of Athens) will be able to vote for or against a .75% increase in the local option sales tax. Here in McMinn County, the polls will be open from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. You must vote at your assigned polling place.

MONDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks finished the day nearly 5% higher. American Airlines suspended change fees for canceled trips, as flight cancellations increase due to the coronavirus. Treasury yields rose for the first time in 10 days.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 1294 points or 5.1% to 26,706. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 135 points or 4.6% to 3,090, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 385 points or 4.5% to 8,952.

Another Joe Guy History Moment

Standing on Hwy 11 between Athens and Niota, the old Cleage House rises above the highway like an old gravestone, the old abandoned house having recently been used as a Halloween attraction. The brick home was built and designed by Samuel Cleage, a traveling builder from Virginia who settled in McMinn County about 1823. Cleage's slaves were master brick makers, evident in the long-lasting buildings that remain today in and around Athens.

East Tennessee has clay that lends itself to brick-making. Cleage's slaves would dig the clay for the buildings on site, and mix it with sand and mussel shells brought in wagon loads from the Hiwassee River. The slaves would slap handfuls of the wet brick mixture into a brick mold, and today crescent-shaped wrinkles are visible in the bricks where air pockets were baked into the bricks. The remarkable bricks made by Cleage's slaves are still visible in such buildings as the Cleage House, Mars Hill Church and the old Railroad Office on Jackson Street in Athens, the Rice House on Madison Avenue in Athens, and the Cate House in Niota.

Cleage freed his slaves at the time of his death in 1850, and these freemen became some of the first black business owners in McMinn County prior to the Civil War. Many white and black families in our area are descended from these master craftsmen and entrepreneurs.
