## **Another Joe Guy History Moment**

Standing behind the old Whiteway Shopping Center, the antebellum mansion originally known as Prospect Hill was built after 1830 by John Deaderick, an enterprising local doctor. The house soon became the property of Deaderick's son-in-law, Thomas Nixon Van Dyke, who was a long-time attorney and judge in Athens.

In 1836, Van Dyke was one of the main supporters in bringing the railroad to Athens and McMinn County. During the Civil War, Van Dyke was a staunch Confederate who grew a long beard after swearing not to cut it until the South won the war, and later was imprisoned at Camp Chase, Ohio for his Confederate sympathies.

The grounds around the house were used as a campsite for Colonel Nathan Bedford Forrest early in the war, and later the house was the headquarters of General William Tecumseh Sherman's staff. Van Dyke would lose 3 of his 4 sons to the war, and afterward he and his family moved to Rome, Georgia where he passed away. His body was returned to Athens and is buried in Cedar Grove Cemetery with the graves of his wife and son.
