Hagerty Wins Senate Primary

Election day has come and gone and here are some of the results. Republican Primary for U.S. Senate: Bill Hagerty won the nomination with about 51% of the vote; Dr. Manny Sethi was the nearest competitor with 39% of the vote out of 15 candidates.

Democratic Primary for U.S. Senate: Marquita Bradshaw won the nomination with about 35% of the vote out of a field of 5 candidates

State Representative Mark Cochran ran unopposed and received over 7500 complimentary votes.

McMinn School Board District 4: Bill Irvin won over Danny Pritchett to fill an unexpired term.

Englewood Mayor: Tony Hawn won with 151 votes, and Jason Hitt received 122 votes.

Etowah City Commission: John James 255, Jim Swayne 254, and Gene Keller 175. The top two candidates were elected.

CORONA VIRUS CASE UPDATE

Tennessee: 116,350 cases to date, up 2,252 in the last 24 hours. The death total is now 1,186, up 42.

McMinn Co: 509 case of the virus to date, up 11. There are 132 active cases and the death total remains at 20.

Monroe Co: 397 cases to date, with 183 active cases. There have been 9 deaths.

Meigs Co: 99 cases to date, with 38 active cases. No deaths.

Polk County: 185 cases and 85 are still active. The total number of deaths is 3.

Bradley Co: 1,817 cases to date. 542 are active. The deaths stand at 12.

- ✓ Athens City Schools officials have announced that students in grades 3 through 8 will be required to wear masks. The school system says the mandate is basked on a recommendation from the Physicians' Task Force. All student will be provided with a mask on the first day of school, Monday, August 10th.
- ✓ The Athens Parks and Recreation Department announces the Ingleside Pool will remain open for pool parties and a weekly swim night as long as weather permits. TODAY IN HISTORY - AUGUST 7th

- **1782 -** The Order of the Purple Heart was established by George Washington to honor Americans wounded in the Revolutionary War.
- **1925 -** Songwriter Felice Bryant was born. She and her husband, Boudleaux wrote dozens of hit songs, including most of the Everly Brothers' hits and the song, "Rocky Top."
- **1928 -** Singer Herb Reed was born. He was a member of the Platters, who had such hits as "My Prayer" and "Smoke Gets In Your Eyes."
- **1942 -** U.S. Marines launched America's first offensive in the Pacific in World War II, as they landed on the island of Guadalcanal.
- **1942 -** Singer B.J. Thomas was born. His hit records include "Raindrops Keep Falling," "Hooked On A Feeling," and "(Hey Won't You Play) Another Somebody Done Somebody Wrong Song."
- **1948** A new Olympic Games record was set when 83,000 spectators attended the final day of track and field events. The Games, held in London, England, had gate receipts totaling more than \$2 million.
- **1971 -** The Apollo 15 moon mission ended successfully as its command module splashed down in the Pacific Ocean.
- **1973 -** Park ranger Roy Sullins was struck by lightning for the 5th time. As usual, he was not huert.
- **2010** Elena Kagan was sworn in as the 112th justice and fourth woman to serve on the U.S. Supreme Court.
