Tennessee: 123,914 cases, up 1,202. Deaths total 1,233, up 10. **McMinn Co:** 553 cases, up 6. There are 155 active cases. The deaths remain at 20.

Meigs Co: 106 cases to date, and 42 of them are active. Monroe Co: 452 cases, 203 active. There have been 9 deaths. Polk Co: 207 cases, 74 are active, and there have been 3 deaths. Bradley Co: 1,956 cases, 610 active, and 13 deaths. Rhea Co: 538 cases, 116 active, and 2 deaths.
