

THURSDAY'S MARKET REPORT:

The U.S. equity market ended mostly down. Initial unemployment claims for the week ending August 8 came in under a million for the first time since the pandemic hit. Uber and Lyft were denied additional time to appeal a court decision requiring the ride-hailing companies to classify drivers as employees in California. Treasury bond prices fell.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 80 points or 0.3% to 27,897. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 7 points or 0.2% to 3,373, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 30 points or 0.3% to 11,043.

In celebration of the 100-year anniversary of when Harry T.
