Police Chief Cliff Couch reported there were 49 thefts, 20 assaults, 6 motor vehicle thefts, 4 burglaries, and 4 sex offenses in Athens in July. Police issued 75 citations for moving violations. There were 59 traffic accidents with 14 injuries and one fatality. There are currently seven vacancies on the police force.

Fire Chief Brandon Ainsworth reported that firefighters responded to 79 calls during July. Three were two building fires and one was a passenger vehicle fire. There were also 27 calls for medical assists and calls to 8 motor vehicle accidents with injuries. Losses totaled \$32,600.00.

Remembering a School Tragedy

On August 22, 1955, a Spring City school bus was struck by a train. Forty-seven children were on the bus. Eleven of them were killed. The railroad crossing had lights and bells, but no crossing guards. The bus had just left Spring City Elementary School which was three blocks east of the railroad tracks. Morning Fax editor Bob Ketchersid was a student at Spring City High School. His mother taught 3rd grade. They arrived at the crash scene just minutes after the accident. Bob says the memories remain vivid in his mind even to this day. He knew several of the children who were on the bus. A few days later, Governor Frank Clement led a memorial service at the Spring City railroad depot. Bob was a member of the band which participated in the memorial service.
