### **Community News You Can Use**

September was the deadliest month yet for COVID-19 in Tennessee. The Tennessee Health Department reported 1,528 new cases of the virus on Wednesday, the last day of the month, bringing the total number of cases statewide to 196,139. Of those, 51 percent are female and 48 percent are male. The Health Department also confirmed 34 additional deaths. The state reported 700 deaths in September, surpassing the 694 deaths in August. Over the month of September, Tennessee averaged 23 deaths each day.

✓ Athens Utilities Board says electricity rates will see a decrease over the next year due to a local rate adjustment that comes from the pandemic relief effort set up by AUB and TVA. TVA approved a 2.5% Wholesale Pandemic Relief Credit for AUB, which will relate to a 1.6% retail rate reduction.

Crews from AUB will flush water lines and fire hydrants throughout the city beginning at 12:30 p.m. next Tuesday, October 6th, weather permitting. During the flushing, residents may experience times of low water pressure and slightly cloudy water. Washing clothes while the work is going on could result in clothes that are dingy or discolored.
