TODAY IN HISTORY - OCTOBER 5th

1931 - Clyde Pangborn and Hugh Herndon completed the first non -stop flight across the Pacific Ocean, arriving in Washington state some 41 hours after leaving Japan.

1936 - Coaxial cable strung between New York City and Philadel phia made it possible for the first intercity telecast. **1947 -** President Harry S. Truman delivered the first televised White House address as he spoke on the world food crisis.

1953 - Earl Warren was sworn in as the 14th chief justice of the

United States, succeeding Fred M. Vinson.

1969 - The British TV comedy program "Monty Python's Flying Circus" made its debut on BBC 1.

1974 - The Beach Boys' Endless Summer was the #1 album in the J.S. Olivia Newton-John had the number-one single. *I Honestly* Love You was #1 for two weeks. The album that single was taken from, *If You Love Me, Let Me Know*, hit number one the following

week after the one-week run by the Beach Boys.

1984 - The space shuttle Challenger blasted off from the Kennedy Space Center on an 8-day mission; the crew included Kathryn D Sullivan, who became the first American woman to walk in space and Marc Garneau, the first Canadian astronaut.

1988 - Democrat Lloyd Bentsen Jambasted Republican Dan Quayle during their vice présidential debate, telling Quayle, "Ser you're no Jack Kennedy." Quayle and George H.W. Bush won. 1999 - Two packed commuter trains collided near London's Pad-

lington Station, killing 31 people.
