100 Quarantined at TWU

Approximately 100 students at Tennessee Wesleyan University are currently in quarantine because of exposure to the COVID -19 virus. TWU President Dr. Harley Knowles says there has been a recent uptick in cases of the virus on campus. He says they have had approximately 17 positive cases. Most of the positive cases and the people in quarantine are student-athletes who are showing mild to no symptoms. Dr. Knowles says in several cases, they are quarantining entire athletic teams out of an abundance of caution. The people in quarantine are only those who have had direct contact for more than 15 minutes with someone who has tested positive. Most of those who have tested positive have chosen to go home and isolate there. Dr. Knowles says a few students cannot get home so they are isolating in single rooms in a section of a residence hall designated for isolation. They are being checked on regularly and food is being delivered.

Dr. Knowles says the increase in positive cases came after the school began doing rapid testing in the Health Center for those who are exhibiting symptoms or those who have had direct exposure to people who have tested positive. He says they are also doing significant contact tracing on campus, which has led to students being directed to the Health Center. Dr. Knowles says as the rapid testing (which gives results in 20 minutes) is ongoing, they are beginning to see an increase in positively. Dr. Knowles says students must be vigilant in wearing masks and keeping their physical distance from one another.

1871 - The Great Chicago Fire started. It destroyed more than 17,000 buildings and killed more than 250 people. Many people believe the fire started when a cow owned by a Mrs. O'Leary kicked over a lighted lantern in a barn. **1890** - World War One flying ace Eddie Rickenbacker was born. He shot down 22 enemy planes. He later became president of Eastern Airlines.

1918 - Sergeant Alvin York of Tennessee became a World War One hero by capturing a hill in the Argonne Forest of France, killing 25 enemy soldiers and capturing 132 others single-handedly.
