# Police/Fire Activity for Sept.

The Athens City Council members heard the reports on police and fire department activity for September at their monthly meeting Tuesday evening.

- Police Chief Cliff Couch reported there were 47 thefts, 18 assaults, 9 burglaries, 5 motor vehicle thefts, and 3 sex offenses in Athens in September. Officers issued 84 citations for moving violations. There were 67 traffic accidents in the city, with 12 injuries.
- Fire Chief Brandon Ainsworth reported that firefighters responded to 131 calls in September. Eighty of the calls were for rescue and emergency medical service. There were also 5 fire calls and 27 false alarms. Losses for the month totaled \$59,000.00.
