Athens Utilities Board reports there were 5.06 inches of precipitation in the month of December. Their rain gauge measured 1.53 inches on December 14th. On December 25th, Christmas Day, AUB reported 1.4 inches of snow, which melted down to .32 inches of precipitation. Precipitation for the year 2020 totaled 78.49 inches. As far as temperatures are concerned, the highest temperature in Athens in December was 65. That was recorded on both December 11th and 12th. The lowest temperature was 11, recorded on December 26th.

Pickup Burns on Highway 30 E

This past Saturday afternoon, a pickup truck caught fire and burned on Highway 30 East near the "Showbarn/McMinn County Health Department Road.
