COVID-19 Vaccination Update

The latest update from the Tennessee Department of Health says Tennessee continues to administer COVID-19 vaccinations according to the state's vaccination plan. Tennessee county health department staff members administered more than 25,000 COVID-19 vaccinations during the New Year weekend, and more than 157,000 total vaccinations have been given statewide to date.

COVID-19 vaccine supplies remain limited at this time, and availability of vaccines varies by county. Tennessee is currently working to vaccinate Phase 1a populations and individuals aged 75 and up. Tennessee counties may progress through COVID-19 phases at different times, depending on supplies of vaccines.

This week shipments of vaccines are expected to begin arriving at Tennessee pharmacies that are partnering with long -term care facilities to vaccinate their residents and staff members onsite. As county health departments vaccinate phases 1a2 and begin to vaccinate those 75 and older, pharmacies will also be administering vaccines for long-term care facility residents. Although this may result in smaller shipments to county health departments, The Tennessee Department of Health says it is critical to get vaccines to those who are at the highest risk of severe illness and death from the virus as quickly as possible.

✓ Athens City Middle School will be going to remote learning January 6-8 due to boiler issues and no heat in the facility. This may be extended through next week depending on availability of parts to repair the boiler. Kids Connection will be open on a regular schedule. Drive-thru meals will be provided each day from 11 a.m.. To 12:30 p.m. for Middle School students and any Athens City Schools virtual students. Students do not have to be present to pick up meals. The switch to remote learning is not related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

✓ The Etowah City Hall Lobby is currently closed until further notice due to COVID-19. Payments may be dropped into the lockbox at the front door. Call 423-263-2202 for assistance.

Today is Epiphany, a holy festival observed in many countries. Originally, it celebrated both the birth and baptism of Jesus. Since the 300s, the day has signified the visit of the three kings or wise men to the Christ Child, signifying the extension of salvation to the Gentiles.

1412 - According to tradition, Joan of Arc was born in Domremy, France. She was the French national heroine who was burned at the stake as a martyr. She led the French army to victory over the British at the siege of Orléans in 1429. She was later captured and condemned by an English court to be burned at the stake.

1759 - George Washington and Martha Dandridge Custis married New Kent County, in
