A Local Board made up of area government officials, agency representatives, United Way, and others will determine how the funds awarded to McMinn County are to be distributed among the emergency food and shelter programs run by local service agencies in the area. Agencies interested in applying are urged to call the United Way office at 745-9606 to review the requirements before applying. McMinn County has distributed Emergency Food and Shelter funds previously with Coordinated Charities, The HOPE Center, Grace and Mercy Ministries, Better Living Center and Nourish One Child participating. Public or private voluntary agencies interested in applying for Emergency Food and Shelter Program funds must contact Paige Zabo at 745-9606 for an application and information about requirements. The Local Board will meet via Zoom on Tuesday, February 2nd at 2:00 pm. The deadline to submit an application is Friday, January 29th.


