

How to Sign Up for the Vaccine

The Tennessee Department of Health and Tennessee's Unified Command Group have added new features to their COVID-19 website to make it easier for users to find county-specific information and request an appointment for COVID-19 vaccination. You can type in the county for which you need information and you will be directed to a page that asks a few questions to see if you are eligible to receive the vaccine at this point. It will also give you information about whether the county has supplies of vaccine, and will give you a phone number to call and will take you to a link to sign up for an appointment. There is a lot of other information on the website as well about the number of COVID cases in each county, hospitalizations, etc. This is the website of the new tool: <u>https://covid19.tn.gov/covid-19-vaccines/eligibility/</u> You can still call 1-866-442-5301 for an appointment.

PRUITT FIRED, FULMER RETIRES

◆ UT football coach Jeremy Pruitt has been fired after three seasons. In 2018 he coached the Vols to upset wins over Kentucky and Auburn, but finished with a 5-7 record. In 2019, the season started with losses to Georgia State and BYU, but the Vols came back with an 8-5 record. The 2020 season was hit by the COVID-19 pandemic, and the Vols finished with a 3-7 record amid investigations into possible wrongdoings by the football program in the areas of compliance and recruiting. There is also word that Athletic Director Phillip will retire from his job.
