More On UT Football Shakeup

More details have been released about the major shakeup in the University of Tennessee football program. The shakeup came as a result of an investigation into potential NCAA viola-

UT Chancellor Dante Plowman says she is moving ahead with the recommendation from Athletic Director Phillip Fulmer to fire head football coach Jeremy Pruitt, two assistant coaches, and seven other members of the football staff. Plowman also announced that she is accepting Fulmer's decision to retire and that she will immediately begin a search for a new athletic director who will, in turn, hire the next football coach.

Chancellor Plowman says it was stunning the number of people involved in the NCAA infractions and says the number of incidents was "shocking." She says, "We want to win, but we want to win with integrity." Chancellor Plowman says UT was advised that the NCAA infractions are Level I and Level II. She also said Pruitt and the other members of the coaching staff are being terminated "for cause." She says there will be no buyout of Pruitt's contract.

Fulmer says he decided to retire in order to allow the new athletic director to hire the next UT head football coach. The whole process of hiring an athletic director and then hiring a new coach could take several months. There are concerns that a number of Tennessee football players may decide to transfer to other schools.

1669 - Susannah Wesley was born. She was the mother of 19 children, including John Wesley who founded the Meth-

1885 - The roller coaster was patented by La Marcus Thompson of, where else, Coney Island, NY. His coaster was 450 feet long with the highest drop being 30 feet.

1894 - Harold Gray, creator of the "Little Orphan Annie" comic strip, was born.

1896 - Comedian George Burns was born.

1922 - Bandleader Ray Anthony was born. His hit records included "Dragnet," "Bunny Hop," and "Peter Gunn."

1924 - Singer Slim Whitman was born. The incomparable singer's hit records include "Indian Love Call," "Secret Love," and "Una Paloma Blanco."

1930 - Astronaut Edwin "Buzz" Aldrin, the second person to walk on the moon, was born.

1937 - Franklin D. Roosevelt's second inauguration was on January 20th. He was the first president to be inaugurated on this day and ever since then, presidents have been inaugurated on January 20th. His first inauguration was on March 4th, 1933.
