Police/Fire Report for December

The Athens City Council heard the reports from the city's police and fire chiefs on December activity at their Tuesday night meeting.

- Police Chief Cliff Couch reported there were 62 thefts in December, 9 assaults, 9 motor vehicle thefts, 7 burglaries, 1 robbery and 1 sex offense. Officers issued 146 citations for moving violations. There were 27 drug crimes reported. In December, there were 66 traffic accidents with 19 injuries. Chief Couch reported there are 5 vacancies on the police force.
- Fire Chief Brandon Ainsworth reported that firefighters responded to 153 calls in December. Of those, there were 8 fires, 103 rescue and emergency medical service calls, and 23 false alarms. The calls involved one building fire, two vehicle fires, and 12 motor vehicle accidents with injuries.

The total number of crimes in Athens in 2020 went down a bit in several categories from 2019.

Assaults: 155 in 2020, down from 164 in 2019 Thefts: 571 in 2020, down from 656 in 2019 Sex offenses: 18 in 2020, down from 20 in 2019

Moving violations: 1195 citations in 2020, down from 2183 in 2019

Homicides: 1 in 2020, up from 0 in 2019 Robberies: 13 in 2020, up from 8 in 2019

Motor vehicle thefts: 72 in 2020, up from 69 in 2019 Traffic accidents: 696 in 2020, down from 929 in 2019

Injuries from traffic accidents: 124 in 2020, down from 143 in 2019

BOATING ACCIDENTS INCREASE IN 2020

After a record low year of eight boating fatalities in 2019, the most boating-related fatalities in 37 years occurred on Tennessee waters with 32 fatalities in 2020. Preliminary numbers indicate about 30% of the 2020 fatal incidents had alcohol or drugs as a contributing factor. In addition to the fatalities, there were 61 serious injury boating incidents that injured 82 individuals.
