MISSING TENNESSEE CHILDREN RECOVERED

Operation Volunteer Strong, a coordinated effort by the TBI, the U.S. Marshals Service, and the Tennessee Department of Children's Services, has led to the recovery of 150 missing children. The operation began last fall when 240 missing children statewide were identified. The recovery operation was launched on January 4th. Fifty-six missing children in East Tennessee were recovered. Five of them were in other states. Authorities identified three of the recovered juveniles as potential human trafficking victims.

WEDNESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: Stocks ended lower as they continue to cool off from Monday's sharp rally, which saw the S&P 500 post its largest daily gain since last June. The NASDAQ Index continues to underperform the broader market, which has seen value stocks holding up better than growth stocks as high-multiple trades unwind.
