McMinn Woman Charged

An investigation by the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation has resulted in the indictment and arrest of a McMinn County woman on identity theft and criminal impersonation charges. In May of

TBI 2020, agents began investigating allegations identity theft involving Ellen Michelle Small, 47. after she applied for nursing position at an assisted living facility in Farragut. During



the course of the investigation, agents determined that Small did not have a nursing license but used the license number of an individual with a similar name to apply for the position. Last week, the Knox County Grand Jury returned indictments charging Small with one count of Identity Theft and one court of Impersonation of a Licensed Professional. She was arrested on Tuesday and booked into the Knox County Jail on a \$5,000 bond.
