WOBBLING MOON MAY CAUSE FLOODING

NASA says a wobbling moon may cause a "dramatic" surge in high-tide flooding in just over a decade. The rapid increase will start in the mid-2030's when a lunar cycle will amplify rising sea levels. This 18.6-year cycle of the moon is caused by a "wobble" in the moon's orbit. The wobble isn't new. It was first reported in 1728. The wobble affects the moon's gravitational pull, which is the main cause of the the ocean tides on Earth.
