


• Larry Calvin McCollister, age 73, of Athens, died July 14th. No services are planned at this time. Companion Funeral Home is in charge of arrangements.

U.S. equities were little changed. Jobless claims unexpectedly rose to 419,000 last week, the biggest jump since the end of March. At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 25.35 to 34,823.35. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 8.79 to 4,367.48, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 52.64 points to 14,684.60.
