✓ A new Senior Citizen Ride Share Program will begin soon at the McMinn Senior Activity Center. It's called MyRide McMinn. Beginning in October, MyRide McMinn will provide door-to-door transportation services to the region's residents age 60 and older. Volunteer drivers will use their personal vehicles to carry seniors medical appointments, banks, grocery stores, Riders will pay a \$25 annual membership fee and a small fee for the first round-trip. Athens Police Sued for Man's Death

A \$20 million wrongful death lawsuit has been filed against the City of Athens and two police officers in the August 2020 death of a man they were taking to jail. The lawsuit says Allen Ott was suffering from a medical emergency. Officers Jeremy Bowman and Beau Swafford responded to a medical call at an Athens car wash where Ott admitted to taking meth and antidepressants. Athens police took him to the hospital where he was checked out. Police body cam video shows the officers struggling to get Ott into a patrol car. They eventually put him into the car face down with his hands cuffed behind his back. Ott's sister, Torie, says the video shows Ott beginning to "uncontrollably spasm and shake." When they reached the jail, Ott was unresponsive and CPR could not revive him. An autopsy determined that the cause of his death was an overdose. The lawsuit says the officers failed to notice the signs that Ott was in serious medical distress. Athens Police Chief Cliff Couch says the officers took him to the emergency room and then to the jail. When they found him unresponsive, they immediately began lifesaving measures and summoned medical help. Chief Couch says a TBI investigation found that Ott died of a drug overdose.
