Primary Election Results

In contested races: District Attorney Steve Crump won the GOP nomination over Stephen Hatchett throughout District 10. Criminal Court Judge Sandra Donaghy won the GOP nomination over Paul Rush throughout District 10. McMinn Circuit Court Clerk Rhonda Cooley won the nomination with 69% of the vote over challenger Doug Bailey. County Commission Dist. 1 Brent Carter, Tad Simpson; Dist. 2 Jerry Millsaps, J.W. McPhail were the two top vote getters.

TUESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks were higher building on Monday's late-day rally. The 10-year Treasury yield retreated some after it broke past the 3% mark on Monday. International stocks were mostly higher, and sentiment remains fragile amid global growth concerns. At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 67.29 to 33,128.79. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 20.10 to 4,175.48, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 27.74 to 12,563.76.



REAL ID Act

The REAL ID Act goes into effect on May 3, 2023. At that time all persons must have a REAL ID license to access certain federal facilities, military bases and board commercial flights within the United States. The Tennessee Department of Safety and Homeland Security (TDOSHS) began issuing REAL IDs on July 1, 2019, and has issued more than 2 million REAL ID credentials to date. To apply for a REAL ID, customers need to bring one proof of U.S. citizenship or legal presence, a valid Social Security Number, and two proofs of Tennessee residency. In addition, if there has been a name change, a certified legal document supporting the name change must be presented with the approved documents. A complete list of accepted documents can be found here. All documents must be originals or certified. Photocopies will not be accepted. It is recommended that you use the option of uploading your required documents beforehand.

TODAY IN HISTORY - May 4th

- **1626** Dutch explorer Peter Minuit landed on Manhattan Island. Native Americans later sold the island (20,000 acres) for \$24 in cloth and buttons.
- 1715 A French manufacturer debuted the first folding umbrella.
- **1776** Rhode Island declared its freedom from England two months before the Declaration of Independence was adopted.
- **1904** The U.S. formally took control of the property for construction of the Panama Canal.
- **1942** The Battle of the Coral Sea commenced as American and Japanese carriers launched their attacks at each other.
