City Council Fire & Police Recap

During Tuesday night's Athens City Council Meeting:

Council Members approved the 2022-2023 budget on first reading.

The VIVID (Very Important Volunteer Individual Award) was presented to William "Skip" White. Skip is a native of North Dakota farm country and attended North Dakota Wesleyan and Duke Divinity School. He is an ordained minister in the Holston Conference of the United Methodist Church and is the chaplain at Tennessee Wesleyan University and Senior Pastor at Trinity UMC. He serves as a Habitat for Humanity Board Member; Read, Lead, Succeed volunteer at North City Elementary School; and youth football and basketball coach.

The Fire Department gave their report for April. They made 182 calls which included 15 fires, 125 for rescue & emergency medical service, 3 non-fire hazardous condition calls, 5 service calls, 13 good intent calls, and 21 false alarm and false calls.

The Athens Police Department had 1,579 calls for service in April bringing the Year to Date total to 6,022. Of those: Sex Offense 2; Robbery 2; Assault 21; Burglary 11; Theft 34; Motor Vehicle Theft 3; Moving Violations 73; Citations 47; Warnings 26; Drugs 42; Arrests 152. Vehicle Accidents 60; Private Property Damage 47; Injuries 9.

The Police Department has 34 sworn positions available of which 28 are filled with 6 vacancies

Wednesday's Market Report

Stocks fell and inflation concerns continue. Equities finished lower. The Dow declined over 1,100 points, as markets more than gave back Tuesday's rally. Investor concerns were heightened by earnings announcements from Target and Walmart as both reported disappointing results. Profit margins are being squeezed by higher labor and input costs.
