Tennessee Unemployment Rates

New data released on June 23rd by the Department of Labor and Workforce Development showed unemployment rates increased slightly during May in each of the state's 95 counties. Even with the minimal increases, 93 of Tennessee's 95 counties maintained rates lower than 5% for the month. The data below shows McMinn and surrounding counties for the month of May:

McMinn increased from 3.4 to 3.8 Meigs increased from 3.6 to 4.0 Polk increased from 3.2 to 3.6 Rhea increased from 3.5 to 4.0 Monroe increased from 2.8 to 3.3 Bradley increased from 3.0 to 3.

THURSDAY'S MARKET REPORT:

Major indexes were lower. Growth-style stocks led the way lower. Stocks closed out the worst first half of a calendar year since 1970. Bond yields were lower, as investors expect further softening of economic growth. The U.S. 10-year Treasury dropped below 3%. Commodities fell, with oil around \$105/barrel. At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 253.88 to 30,775.43. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 33.45 to 3,785.38, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 149.16 to 11,028.74.

✓ Another law taking effect July 1 strengthens the penalty for anyone who harms a law enforcement or service animal in Tennessee. Known as Joker's Law and sponsored by Senator Mike Bell of Riceville, the bill increases the penalty for anyone who knowingly and unlawfully kills a police dog, fire dog, search and rescue dog, service animal or police horse. Offenders would now be charged with a Class B felony.
