#### FRIDAY'S MARKET REPORT:

Stocks ended slightly lower. Tech-heavy Nasdaq continues to outperform. Asian markets traded higher. Government bonds declined. The 10-year Treasury yield rose to 3.77%. At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Average was down 108.94 to 34,299.12. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 16.25 to 4,409.59, and the NASDAO Composite Index was down 93.25 to 13,689.57.

## **Today In History**

1903 - Baseball player Lou Gehrig was born. He was a star first baseman and hitter for the New York Yankees. He played in 2,130 consecutive games. He died at the age of 37 from a rare and fatal form of paralysis, ALS, which has since come to be called "Lou Gehrig's Disease." 1914 - Bluegrass pioneer Lester Flatt was born. Along with banjo player Earl Scruggs, he had scores of hit records, including "Foggy Mountain Breakdown," "Cabin In the Hills," and "The Ballad of Jed Clampett."

1934 - Congress created the Federal Communications Commission to regulate interstate communications, including radio and television broadcasting. Among other things, the FCC assigns frequencies and issues licenses. 2000 - The Supreme Court, in a 6-3 ruling, barred officials from letting students lead stadium crowds in prayer before football games.
