

TN Receives **Tobacco Master Settlement Payment**

Tennessee Attorney General Jonathan Skrmetti announced that the state has received a payment of \$146.1 million from major tobacco companies as part of the Tobacco Master Settlement Agreement. Since 1998, Tennessee has received a total of \$3.9 billion from this agreement. Skrmetti emphasized the importance of protecting Tennessee's youth from corporate exploitation, highlighting the state's ongoing efforts to hold Big Tobacco accountable for past misconduct. The landmark agreement addressed violations of consumer protection laws and deceptive marketing practices by tobacco companies, leading to increased healthcare costs for the state. Skrmetti's office oversees enforcement of the agreement and regulation of tobacco companies operating in Tennessee, ensuring compliance with legal obligations and public health measures. The annual payments from the settlement help cover healthcare expenses related to smoking-related illnesses, while also implementing measures to protect Tennesseans, including restrictions on youth marketing and tobacco-sponsored events. The DEA and its collaborators will accept tablets, capsules, patches, and other solid forms of prescription drugs. This event, spanning over a decade, aims to help Americans safely dispose of old, unwanted, or expired medications, which can often lead to addiction. Take Back Day offers free and anonymous disposal at over 4,000 drop-off locations nationwide. Through collaboration with local law enforcement, Take Back Day has eliminated over 8,300 tons of medication from circulation since its inception. Please note that collection sites will not accept syringes, sharps, or illicit drugs. Liquid products, such as cough syrup, should remain sealed in their original container with tightly sealed caps.
