\$1.1 Million of Meth Seized in Kingsport



Two individuals were apprehended close to Kingsport following the discovery of \$1.1 million worth of methamphetamine in a vehicle, as per the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office.

The sheriff's office announced on Thursday that Mark Anthony Trent, 37 from Mount Carmel, and Saundra Kay Hamilton, 51 from Kingsport, are facing multiple charges. Law enforcement reported that deputies observed a speeding vehicle on Interstate 26 near mile marker 8 and initiated a traffic stop on Wednesday at approximately 2 a.m. Subsequently, deputies requested assistance from the Kingsport Police Department's K-9 unit, whose canine alerted to the presence of drugs in the vehicle. Following a search, 42.13 pounds of crystal methamphetamine were discovered inside the vehicle.
