Car Overturned in Etowah, Tuesday




After the driver lost control of a 2010 Scion, the vehicle veered off the roadway and overturned, trapping the passenger's hand under the car. The accident occurred around 12:30 pm on Tuesday at the intersection of County Roads 660 and 633 in Etowah. Fire personnel

extricated the passenger, who was then treated by AMR and transported to Erlanger Hospital in Chattanooga. The driver refused medical treatment. Responding to the scene were Claxton Fire, Etowah Rural Fire, Etowah City Fire Departments, McMinn County Sheriff's Department, and THP Officer Dean Conk, who investigated the accident. 

On Saturday, June 29, the 2024 Homeschool Marketplace and Used Curriculum Sale hosted by Mid-East THEA, was a successful community event, with the E.G. Fisher Public Library Community Room bursting at the seams, and overflowing onto the covered patio!







The sale featured an abundance of used curriculum, which helped many local homeschool parents find new curriculum for their children's next year of school. Also for sale were used books, crafts, children's clothing, baked goods, hand-crafted jewelry, office supplies, and refreshments including ice-cold lemonade and pizza. The lemonade stand was even built by and managed by homeschool teens! Also featured at the sale this year were several "kidentrepreneurs," an increasingly popular aspect of homeschool sales. Kid-entrepreneur youth provided

their own creations, whether artisan crafts, baked goods, refreshments, and even their own gently used toys or collection items to sell and in some cases, even their very own self-authored books; and in turn, learn about the free-market and the basics of starting a business!

The sale was hosted by area homeschooling families connected by the Mid-East THEA organization, with the public invited to come in and shop. By several accounts of happy sellers, taking far less home than what they brought in, the event was a success! Armloads full of books and supplies, crafts and sweets, were being loaded into buyer's vehicles. While there, visitors were also able to speak with veteran homeschooling parents, ask questions about area co-ops, activities, groups, field trips, and more related to home-education!

Wednesday. The cleanup, aiming to remove 25 billion pieces of trash before the US' 250th anniversary in two years, is part of a five-step initiative launched by Keep America Beautiful.
