AAA - Gas Prices Remain Stationary

Barely budging since June, the national average for a gallon of gas squeaked out a two-penny increase to \$3.52 since last week. The national average has hovered around \$3.50 per gallon since June 26th.

Andrew Gross, AAA spokesperson stated, "Oil prices have fallen quite a bit lately. In April, a barrel of oil was in the upper \$80s, but today, it is \$10 a barrel cheaper. That might mitigate any upward pressure on pump prices."

According to new data from the Energy Information Administration (EIA), gas demand rose unexpectedly from 8.78 million b/d to 9.45 last week. Meanwhile, total domestic gasoline stocks fell from 233 to 227.4 million barrels. Gasoline production rose last week, averaging 10.2 million barrels per day. Higher gasoline demand but lower oil costs may keep pump prices relatively stable for now. The average gas price in Tennessee has fallen by five cents since last Thursday.

Nissan Rogue Named "Coolest Thing Made in Tennessee"



Today In History - July 26

- **1775** A postal system was established by the 2nd Continental Congress. The first Postmaster General was Benjamin Franklin. He was paid \$1,000 a year, equal to \$40,801.95 today.
- **1788 -** New York became the 11th state. New York City used to be the capital, but in 1796 the capital was moved to Albany.
- **1945 -** Winston Churchill resigned as Britain's prime minister after his Conservatives were soundly defeated by the Labor Party. He was succeeded by Clement Attlee.
