Northeast Tennessee and Western North Carolina were recently devastated by the effects of Hurricane Helene. Strong winds and heavy rains caused massive amounts of flooding that in some cases have left some towns without a single building standing. Others were left without communications to the outside world with no way for us to know their exact condition. Monroe Co. Man Indicted for Sexual Assault

An investigation by TBI special agents into a sexual assault allegation has resulted in the indictment and arrest of a Madisonville man.

At the request of 10th Judicial District Attorney General Stephen Hatchett, on September 5th, TBI special agents began investigating a complaint of a sexual assault that took place on August 24th. During the course of the investigation, agents developed information that Brian Hodge had committed sexual battery against an individual at the Monroe County EMS Station in Madisonville.

On October 2nd, the Monroe County Grand Jury returned an indictment charging Brian Keith Hodge (DOB 07/20/1984) with one count of Sexual Battery. TBI agents took Hodge into custody and transported him to the Monroe County Jail, where he was booked. His bond was set at \$10,000.

The charges and allegations referenced in this release are merely accusations of criminal conduct and not evidence. The defendant is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt and convicted through due process of law.

IRS to Provide Tax Relief to Helene Victims

The IRS is providing tax relief to individuals and businesses in parts of Tennessee impacted by Tropical Storm Helene, following a FEMA disaster declaration. Affected taxpayers now have until May 1, 2025, to file various federal tax returns and make payments.

Individuals and households in the following Tennessee counties qualify:

- Carter
- Cocke
- Greene
- Hamblen
- Hawkins
- Johnson
- Unicoi
- Washington

Deadlines for filing after September 26, 2024, and before May 1, 2025, are extended to May 1, 2025.

The deadline applies to:

- Individuals who had a valid extension to file their 2023 return due to run out on Oct. 15, 2024. The IRS noted, however, that because tax payments related to these 2023 returns were due on April 15, 2024, those payments are not eligible for this relief.
- Calendar-year corporations whose 2023 extensions run out on

Oct. 15, 2024.

- Any payment normally due during this period, including the quarterly estimated tax payments due on Jan. 15, and April 15, 2025.
- The quarterly payroll and excise tax returns that are normally due on Oct. 31, 2024, and Jan. 31, and April 30, 2025.

Penalties for payroll and excise tax deposits due between September 26 and October 11, 2024, will be waived if deposits are made by the October date.

The IRS will automatically apply relief to affected taxpayers in the disaster area. *Those living outside the designated area who were impacted should contact the IRS disaster hotline at 866-562-5227*

Tax preparers in the disaster area with clients located outside the area can choose the <u>'bulk requests from practitioners for disaster</u> relief' option on the <u>IRS website</u>.
