September Unemployment Rates

In September, 91 out of 95 Tennessee counties reported unemployment rates below 5%, despite most counties seeing slight increases from August. Rates rose in 77 counties, stayed the same in 13, and fell in five. Tennessee's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate stood at 3.2%, lower than the national average of 4.1%. Residents can explore job opportunities and resources through the state's American Job Centers or online services.

Monday Fire on County Road 655



Early Monday morning, around 4 am, the McMinn County Sheriff's Department was first to respond to a fully involved structure fire on County Road 655 in Athens. The family was alerted by smoke detectors and noticed smoke after opening an interior door, but all members were able to escape safely, according to Riceville Rural Fire Chief Brandon Ainsworth.

Multiple agencies joined in response, including Riceville Rural Fire, Claxton Fire, Calhoun Fire, Athens Rural Fire, Englewood Rural Fire, Etowah Rural Fire, North McMinn Fire, Clearwater Rural Fire, and Niota Rural Fire Departments. Additional support came from AMR and VEC.

Fire districts were covered by Etowah City Fire, Athens City Fire, West Polk Fire, and Madisonville City Fire Departments. Riceville Rural Fire Chief Ainsworth

led the operations on the scene.

ELECTION RESULTS: Yesterday's election may go down as one of the "reddist" in history locally and even across Tennessee. Republicans swept nearly every partisan contest. President Trump carried McMinn County with 82% of the vote as opposed to Vice President Kamala Harris, who received 17% locally. Across Tennessee, Trump received 64% whereas Harris got 34%. Third District Congressman Chuck Fleischmann will return to Washington for another term with 79% of the vote in McMinn County and 68% district wide. Fleischman was opposed by Democrat Jack Allen, a former resident of Athens and the former President of Citizens National Bank prior to its merger with Simmons Bank. Senator Marsha Blackburn received 80% of the vote locally and 64% statewide. Her opponent, Democrat Gloria Johnson of Knoxville, received 18% locally and 34% statewide. State Representative Mark Cochran won another term with an 85% margin while Democrat David Thomforde received 15%. The Athens City Council will soon have a new member. In a 3-way race for two seats, the two top vote getters were incumbent Jordan Curtis (2984) and John Duggan (2773). Newcomer Perry McCowan came in 3rd place with 2006 votes. The Athens City School Board will have a new member, Republican Stan Harrison, who won 41% of the vote, while independent incumbents Chris Adams and Beth Jackson won 30% and 29% respectively. Justin Evans, Evan Thomas and Mark Ledford were the top 3 vote getters in a 6-way race for the Calhoun City Commission. In the Niota City Commission election, there were 3 candidates running for 3 seats. David Dilbeck, Shelby Renee Brakebill and Robert Aaron Arnwine were elected. McMinn Director of Elections, TeAnna McKinney, reported that there were a large number of provisional ballots cast and it will be several days before they will be counted which could change some of the unofficial totals mentioned previously.

Joint Compliance Nets Numerous Citations for Vape Sales

A joint operation in McMinn, Polk, Bradley, and Monroe Counties has resulted in several citations to businesses for illegal vape sales. According to Sheriff Joe Guy in a joint press release with other area law enforcement agencies, District Attorney General, and DTF Director, the issue of vaping devices being sold to juveniles in turning up in area schools is a problem that all law enforcement agencies share. In Tennessee, an individual must be 21 years old to purchase a tobacco product such as a vaping device. Sale to a person under the age of 21 is a class C misdemeanor. "We all see it daily in our local schools," said Sheriff Guy. "And juveniles are being sold the devices without their ID being checked, or simply sold illegally at area stores. This was made possible with the support of General Hatchett's Office and the Drug Task Force" According to the joint statement, on Tuesday, October 29, 2024, the 10th Judicial District Drug Task Force conducted a compliance check of forty-seven local businesses in Bradley, McMinn, Monroe, and Polk County, Tennessee in reference to the sale of Vape and THC products to individuals under the age of twenty-one. As a result of the operation seventeen businesses were found to have violated state law. The Task Force issued a total of thirty-four citations during this operation. District Attorney General Stephen M. Hatchett is quoted as saying: "The District Attorney's Office and all our law enforcement partners are committed to preventing youth access to Tobacco, Smoking Hemp and Vapor Products. We have received multiple complaints from our community and our schools regarding these products and we have taken proactive action to stop these products from being sold to our youth. We truly appreciate ATS The Bridge and the Monroe County Wellness and Prevention Coalition helping with these enforcement actions. This is notice to any establishments in the 10th Judicial District selling these products that enforcement actions will continue to protect our youth". Athens Police Department, ATS The Bridge, Bradley County Sheriff's Office, Cleveland Police Department, McMinn County Sheriff's Office, Monroe County Sheriff's Office, Monroe County Prevention and Wellness Coalition, Polk County Sheriff's Office, and Sweetwater Police Department, assisted the Task Force with this operation. All agency heads agreed this was a successful effort, and it will be repeated in the future. Source: Joe Guy, MCSO
