# Nov. 11 Brings Pride and Patriotism in Saluting Veterans



World War I – known at the time as "The Great War" – officially ended when the Treaty of Versailles was signed on June 28, 1919, in the Palace of Versailles outside the town of Versailles, France. However, fighting ceased seven months earlier when an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, between the Allied nations and Germany went into effect on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. For that reason, November 11, 1918, is generally regarded as the end of "the war to end all wars."

Veterans Day continues to be observed on November 11, regardless of what day of the week on which it falls. The restoration of the observance of Veterans Day to November 11 not only preserves the historical significance of the date, but helps focus attention on the important purpose of Veterans Day: A celebration to honor America's veterans for their patriot-

ism, love of country, and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good.



#### **Unattended Debris Fire Sparks Blaze at Renovation Site in Delano**





Saturday night, a structure fire on Highway 411 in Delano prompted a mutual aid request from the West Polk Fire Department. When additional fire units arrived, flames were still visible from the roof. The residence, undergoing renovations, suffered extensive damage.



West Polk Administrative Chief Stephen Lofty reported that the fire originated in the backyard, where renovators had set debris and old furniture ablaze, leaving the fire unattended. Wind carried embers onto the roof, igniting the structure.

Responding agencies included West Polk Fire, Etowah Rural Fire, Englewood Rural Fire, AmeriPro EMS, Polk County Sheriff's Department, and EUB. Bradley County and Madisonville City fire departments provided standby support. Chief Lofty commanded the scene, with Etowah Rural Fire Chief

Adam Hafley overseeing operations. No injuries were reported.



# 16th Annual Cottonfest Set for Saturday, November 23

The 16th Annual *CottonFest Pickin' for a Cure* will be held at the Etowah Community Center starting at 11:00 a.m. and will wrap up

around 5:00. Tickets are \$10.00 each with children under 10 free. Food trucks for the day are Salty Mel's Roots Authentic Puerto Rican Food and The Traveling Lunchbox.

Pancreatic cancer has a 99% mortality rate, the highest rate of any cancer. The average life expectancy after diagnosis is just 3-5 months. Despite the lethal nature of this disease, only 1% of the National Cancer Institute's current budget is focused on pancreatic research. Etowah native Ronnie Raper, Jr. knows about pancreatic cancer in a very personal way – his father-in-law Doyle Williams passed away in 1995 and the illness claimed his father Ronnie "Cotton" Raper in 2006. Raper made a proactive choice in 2007 to form CottonFest – a nonprofit pancreatic fundraiser and for the last 20 years he along with the CottonFest board of directors have been actively raising money for research treatment and education and have served as a reference source for pancreatic cancer patients and their families.
