McMinn Senior Activity Center Opens Applications for Safe at Home Program

The McMinn Senior Activity Center has opened applications for its *Safe at Home* program, which offers financial assistance to seniors dealing with three major challenges: food insecurity, senior safety, and home repairs. This initiative, supported by grants from the Athens Federal Foundation and the TVA Community Care Fund, is designed to help older adults manage rising living costs.

"We are blessed to have organizations like Athens Federal Foundation and TVA Community Care Fund supporting these vital social services," said Diane Hutsell, Executive Director of the McMinn County Senior Activity Center. "The high costs of everything from food to housing continue to impact seniors, especially those on fixed incomes."

The program, expanded this year to include those aged 50 and older, provides assistance for a wide range of needs, including food pantry access, SETHRA public transportation costs, home repairs such as roof or gutter work, wheelchair ramps, grab bar installations, and medical devices like hearing aids and medic alert systems. Utility assistance and heating/cooling system repairs are also covered.

Eligibility Requirements

Applicants must:


- 1.Be aged 50 and older
- 2. Reside in McMinn County
- 3.Applicants must work with the MSAC Senior Advocate and must have exhausted all other funding resources.
- 4.Applicants may only apply for funds one (1) time per year (within 365 days) but applications will be available year-round as long as funding is available and will be processed in the order they are received.
- 5. Funds will be paid directly to the service provider or in the form of a gift card depending on the request. NO CHECKS will be written/paid directly to the applicant.
- "According to the AARP, 77% of adults 50 and older hope to age in their own homes," Hutsell added. "This program helps make that possible by addressing essential needs like groceries, transportation, and home safety improvements."

Applications are processed on a first-come, first-served basis. For more information or to apply, visit www.mcminnseniors.com or call 423-745-6830 to schedule an appointment with the Senior Advocate.

Friendly Fellow Club Food Basket Drive Returns this December

The Friendly Fellow Club food basket drive, a Christmastime tradition for the Athens and McMinn County community for almost 90 years, will be held again this December. Started by J. Neal Ensminger and Frank Buttram, the effort serves households in the community with food to get them through the winter. The Friendly Fellow Club is a 501(c)(3) organization. Not only are the donations tax-deductible, but because the Friendly Fellow Club operates under an all-volunteer board, 100 percent of all donations—every single penny—goes to help families in Athens and McMinn County. Beginning this week of November 11th, applications for assistance will be available for pickup from the drive-through windows of the McMinn County branches of the following financial institutions: Old National Bank, Simmons Bank, Truist Bank, Peoples Bank of East Tennessee, SouthEast Bank, Citizens National Bank, Tennessee Valley Federal Credit Union, ORNL Federal Credit Union, or Bowater Credit Union. Applications must be returned to those financial institutions' drive-through windows or mailed by the close of business on Saturday, November 30, 2024. For those wishing to mail applications, send them to Friendly Fellow Club, P.O. Box 325, Athens, TN 37371-0325. Applicants are asked to return only the white copy of their application and keep the yellow copy for


verification purposes when picking up their food box. All applicants must reside within McMinn County, Tennessee, in order to qualify for assistance. The boxes will be packed and distributed at the National Guard Armory, located between Athens and Etowah off Highway 30. Boxes will be packaged on Wednesday, December 18, 2024, at 6:00 p.m. They will be distributed to members of eligible households at the same location on Thursday, December 19, 2024, from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. No boxes will be available after 11:30 a.m. on December 19. Online donations via credit/debit card or PayPal can be made online at friendlyfellows.org by clicking the donate button. Donations can also be mailed to P.O. Box 325, Athens, TN 37371- 0325 or dropped off at The Daily Post-Athenian offices on Washington Avenue in Downtown Athens. Make checks payable to Friendly Fellow Club. Donations in honor or memory of a loved one are always a

special tribute and are most welcome. Donors using the online payment portal can add an "in honor of" or "in memory of" by including that information in the "Add Note" section of the donation portal. For more information, visit friendlyfellows.org
