Over 600 Tennessee Sober Drivers Face DUI Arrests Amid Testing Backlogs



Body camera footage shows Xavier Gray with his hands raised as Wilson County deputies approach his car. Gray, on his way to work on May 17, 2024, was stopped and later arrested for DUI. Despite showing no signs of alcohol or drug use in subsequent blood tests, Gray was charged based on field sobriety test results and alleged impairment. "I don't even drink," Gray said. "I was scared about losing my license. Driving is my livelihood."

Gray's case is one of hundreds uncovered by WSMV4 Investigates, revealing a troubling trend: sober drivers being wrongfully arrested for DUI in Tennessee. Data from the Tennessee.

see Bureau of Investigation (TBI) shows that from 2017 to 2023, over 31,000 people were arrested for DUI with 0.00% alcohol in their system. However, the data does not specify how many were also drug-free. Due to a backlog in processing toxicology tests, innocent drivers often face severe consequences, including job loss and increased insurance rates, while waiting to clear their names. The TBI acknowledges sober DUI arrests are rare, less than 1% of cases, but with approximately 15,000 DUI arrests annually, this still results in hundreds of wrongful arrests.

Alex Otte, executive director of Mothers Against Drunk Driving in Tennessee, called the situation "tragic" but noted that the focus should remain on preventing impaired driving. Meanwhile, Gray and others question the justice system's impact on innocent lives.

Rep. Lowell Russell of Vonore, is pushing for greater transparency, urging the TBI to release detailed data on DUI arrests and case outcomes. As *WSMV4 Investigates* continues to seek answers, Gray reflects on the ordeal: "It's scary how easily your life can be upended despite doing everything right."

For now, the TBI has promised to work on compiling more comprehensive data, but questions remain about the system's impact on Tennessee's sober drivers. **Source: WSMV.com**



Iamaleava's Status Uncertain as UT Prepares for Pivotal Clash with Georgia



Tennessee quarterback Nico Iamaleava remains in concussion protocol but has shown promising progress in practice ahead of Saturday's crucial matchup against No. 12 Georgia. Coach Josh Heupel addressed Iamaleava's status during Wednesday's SEC coaches teleconference, expressing cautious optimism while emphasizing that official updates will come via the SEC's student-athlete availability report, released Wednesday evening and updated daily through game day.

Iamaleava sustained the injury during last weekend's 33-14 victory over Mississippi State and did not return after halftime. Tennessee (8-1, 5-1 SEC) needs its redshirt freshman quar-

terback, who has hit his stride in recent games, completing 65% of his passes for 1,879 yards, 11 touchdowns, and four interceptions this season.

The stakes couldn't be higher as a win would keep Tennessee in control of its playoff destiny and SEC title aspirations, while a loss could derail those ambitions. For Georgia (7-2, 5-2 SEC), the game offers a chance to claw back into playoff contention. Georgia coach Kirby Smart said he's preparing as if Iamaleava will play unless officially ruled out.

If Iamaleava is sidelined, backup Gaston Moore, a fifth-year senior and seasoned veteran of Heupel's offense, would start. Moore has limited experience, completing 16 of 25 passes for 201 yards, two touchdowns, and two interceptions this season. Freshman Jake Merklinger, the No. 3 quarterback, could also see action if needed.

The SEC availability report will be closely monitored, with final updates due 90 minutes before Saturday's 7:30 p.m. ET kickoff in Athens, Georgia. This transparency is key as the Vols prepare for one of their most significant games of the season.
