Georgia Stifles Tennessee, Reignites Playoff Hopes with 31-17 Victory




Facing near-elimination from the College Football Playoffs, No. 12 Georgia surged to a 31-17 win over No. 7 Tennessee, rallying from a 10 -0 second-quarter deficit. Carson Beck led the charge with 347 passing yards, three total touchdowns, and zero turnovers, while Georgia's defense delivered a second-half shutout.

The Bulldogs, rebounding from a loss to Ole Miss, are back in the CFP conversation, boasting wins over three Top 25 teams. Tennessee, meanwhile, is on the playoff bubble, with just one marquee victory and only UTEP and Vanderbilt left on the schedule. Beck's performance was bolstered by strong pass protection, veteran tight end Oscar Delp's two touchdown receptions, and a balanced receiving corps. The Vols struggled to pressure Beck, recording zero sacks despite their typically formidable defensive front.

For Tennessee, the loss is a severe setback, jeopardizing their playoff dreams. They must now hope for decisive wins and favorable outcomes elsewhere as the CFP committee deliberates. Meanwhile, Georgia's road to redemption continues, with the Bulldogs eyeing a strong finish and a potential playoff spot. However, while Tennessee suffered a crushing defeat, their hopes for playoff contention might not be completely extinguished. On Monday, Bob Hodge of The Sports Source offered this take on the Vols after their Georgia loss.

"Here's my theory for Tennessee's playoff chances: If everything stays the same for UT, if they win the rest of the games this season, and Notre Dame loses, they might still have a chance to get to the playoffs. The easiest path for Tennessee (to enter the CFP) is to get Notre Dame out of the way."
