Kaliyah went into the McMinn County foster care system as a toddler and was adopted by CASA advocates Judith Williams and Marshal Arnwine along with her sister Jaya. She began volunteering for CASA at the age of six for the annual CASA Awareness Walk/5k.

CASA Corridor of East Tennessee is a non-profit organization which began advocating for abused and/or neglected children in 2007. The mission of CASA is to recruit, train and supervise citizen volunteers to speak out for the best interest of children who are before juvenile courts of McMinn, Meigs and Rhea Counties. The agency works to preserve the rights of each child to a safe and permanent home. CASA recruits and trains diverse volunteers to act as advocates for the best interest of children involved in court proceedings primarily as the result of child abuse. CASA has served 5,300 children in this area since its inception and has made a difference in so many young people's lives thanks to countless hours of court appearances by advocates and through donations by grants and private funds. Former TWRA Officer Pleads Guilty to Misusing State Funds




A former Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency (TWRA) officer, Travis Buchanan, pleaded guilty on Friday to theft after misusing state funds for personal gain over several years.

The investigation began in February 2023 when TWRA officials detected discrepancies in gasoline purchases for Buchan-

an's state-issued truck. An audit revealed that his fuel expenses exceeded what was needed based on the vehicle's mileage and fuel efficiency. Surveillance footage later showed Buchanan using a state credit card to buy excess fuel, which he stored in gas containers in his truck.

Buchanan, who served with TWRA for 19 years, was indicted in September 2023. He was sentenced to six years of probation and ordered to pay \$46,000 in restitution. Buchanan also forfeited his state pension and is permanently barred from working for the State of Tennessee. *Source: WVLT*
