

## **TVFCU Breaks Records with Holiday Donations for Angel Tree Program**

Tennessee Valley Federal Credit Union (TVFCU) employees and community members set a new milestone this year by providing holiday gift bags for about 185 children and seniors through The Salvation Army Angel Tree program. They also contributed approximately 390 additional gifts across Tennessee and Northwest Georgia, mark-

ing the credit union's largest-ever holiday contribution.

"TVFCU [adopted] more angels than any other business in Chattanooga, [helping us serve] around 3,000 people," said Kendall Hudson, community relations and development manager at The Salvation Army in Chattanooga.

Since 2006, TVFCU has hosted a Thanksgiving employee food auction to support the Angel Tree program, raising \$11,500 this year—enough to adopt 62 angels. Ten TVFCU branches housed Angel Trees, while seven others supported holiday initiatives like the Stocking Full of Love program and Toys & Coats for Kids. "The holiday spirit really comes alive through TVFCU's efforts," said Lisa Elrod, vice president of branch operations.

### Tennessee Adds 56,000 Jobs Despite Slight Unemployment Increase




Tennessee employers added 56,000 nonfarm jobs over the past year, marking the state's largest annual job growth in 2024, according to the Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce

Development. The health care and social assistance sector led the gains, followed by professional, scientific, and technical services, and retail trade.

Despite this growth, Tennessee's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate rose to 3.5% in November, up from 3.3% in October but still below the national rate of 4.2%. The state previously achieved a record-low unemployment rate of 3% earlier this year.

Between October and November 2024, Tennessee added 6,300 jobs, with the health care sector and local government showing significant increases. Tennessee's unemployment rate remains well below the national average, reflecting continued strength in the job market.

## **TBI Arrests 10 in Operation Autumn Shield**

The Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) says their Task Force has identified 14 known victims of online child sextortion in Tennessee.

The victims were located as a part of TBI operation "Autumn Shield," which led to the arrest of 10 people. The TBI say most of these victims were on social media platforms such as Instagram and Snapchat.

The 3 men facing charges from our area include: Michael Williford of Sequatchie County, Joshua Long of Marion County, and Rory Frerichs of Polk County. The TBI says one of the ten suspects used Artificial Intelligence (AI) to create a nude image of his underage daughter and shared it online.

The technology allows a user to create new images or videos based on the user's requests. The National Center for Missing & Exploited Children says generative AI is a huge concern.

Their CyberTipline has received more than 7,000 child sexual exploitation reports involving this over the past two years. Sequachie County Sheriff Phillips also says there are several apps for parents that monitor text messages, social media, and emails to ensure kids are staying safe online.

### Josh Heupel Named Semifinalist for George Munger Award



After leading Tennessee to a 10-win season and its first College Football Playoff berth, head coach Josh Heupel has been named a semifinalist for the prestigious George Munger Award, recognizing college football's most outstanding coach. This marks Heupel's

second semifinalist nod in three years, having been a finalist in 2022. Heupel joins legendary Tennessee coaches Phillip Fulmer and Gen. Robert Neyland as the only ones to achieve multiple 10-win regular seasons.

Under Heupel, the Vols finished the 2024 regular season tied for second in the SEC and ranked in the top 10 nationally in 12 key statistical categories, including scoring defense, rushing defense, and total offense. Tennessee has amassed 30 wins over the past three seasons, the most since 1998-2000, cementing Heupel's impact on the program.

The No. 9 Vols will face No. 8 Ohio State in the College Football Playoff on Saturday at 8 p.m. ET, live on ABC and ESPN. *Source: UTSports.com*
