

Central Basketball Round-Up



McMinn Central basketball hosted district 3-2A foe Kingston on Friday night. The Chargerettes jumped out to a 12-2 lead that stretched to 49-17 at the half in route to a dominant 84-31 win. Karina Bystry scored 35 points and led the team with 5 assists and 6 steals. Reagan Baker added 15 points,

3 assists, and 3 steals, and tied Malea Masingale for the team lead with 7 rebounds. Malea Masingale scored 14 points. Alahna Powell added 10 points off the bench. Camryn Loden scored 6 points and tied Bystry with 6 steals. The win improves the Chargerettes to 24-1 overall as part of a 23-game win streak. They are now 8-0 in district play and have clinched the top seed in the district tournament.

The Chargers built a 34-24 lead in the second quarter lead over the top 5 ranked Yellowjackets, but Kingston closed out the half on a 6-0 run to tie the game at 38 at the half. Kingston surged ahead 55-44 in the third quarter, but the Chargers' 13-2 run tied the game at 57. Unfortunately, Kingston had the final surge in the fourth quarter and defeated the Chargers 91-80. Will Benton recorded a double-double with 20 points and 13 rebounds. Daylen Spradling scored 18 points, grabbed 8 rebounds, and led the team with 5 assists. Ray McCarty scored 18 points, grabbed 7 rebounds, and dished out 4 assists. Carter Anderson scored 14 points. The loss drops the Chargers' record to 8-16 overall and 3-5 in district 3-2A.

No. 8 Tennessee Stuns No. 5 Florida with Dominant 64-44 Win



Despite missing two key starters, No. 8 Tennessee delivered a statement victory over No. 5 Florida, 64-44, on Saturday at a sold-out Food City Center. The Volunteers, playing with only seven scholarship players, extended their SEC record to six consecutive home wins against AP top-five opponents.

Tennessee (18-4, 5-4 SEC) was without senior guard Zakai Zeigler (knee) and forward Igor Miličić Jr. (illness), but their teammates stepped up in a big way. Chaz Lanier led all scorers with 19 points, going 5-for-9 from three-point range, while Jordan Gainey contributed 16 points, five assists, and three steals. Felix Okpara and Jahmai Mashack anchored the paint with eight rebounds each, while Cade Phillips added seven points and three blocks in a career-high of just 28 minutes.

Both teams struggled offensively early, with Tennessee missing its first four shots and Florida missing its first five. The Gators led 6-2 before the Vols responded, taking a 14-13 lead on a Lanier three-pointer. Tennessee then held Florida scoreless for 5:45 and forced six consecutive missed shots. The game remained tight through halftime, with the Vols leading 24-21, despite both teams shooting under 30% from the field in the first half. The Volunteers came out on fire after the break, opening with a 6-0 run and extending it to 14-2 to push their lead to 30-21. A three-pointer by Gainey made it 43-30 with 12:59 remaining, and Tennessee's defense continued to smother the Gators, forcing five straight misses over a six-minute span. A 9-0 Vols run extended the lead to 19 points (52-33) with 6:46 left, effectively sealing the victory. Lanier hit back-to-back threes to push the margin to 21 before Tennessee coasted to the 20-point win.

Tennessee's defense shut down Florida, holding the Gators to just 24.5% shooting (13-of-53) and 14.8% from three (4-of-27) —their worst shooting performance in two decades. Florida's 44 points marked their lowest scoring total in nearly 35 years (since 1990).

The Volunteers wrap up their three-game homestand against No. 20 Missouri on Wednesday at 7 p.m. on the SEC Network.
