Fatal Head-On Collision on Highway 310

A 2005 Dodge Dakota Club Cab SLT and a 2018 Nissan Maxima collided head-on Thursday around 1 p.m. on Highway 310 at County Road 480. The driver of the Nissan Maxima was pronounced dead at the scene and required extrication by fire personnel, while the Dodge Dakota driver was transported to Starr Regional Etowah by AMR.

Teen Suspect in Fatal Alcoa Crash Transferred to Adult Court



A Blount County Juvenile Court judge has ordered 17-year-old Maddex Forsythe to be tried as an adult for felony murder in the death of Madison Hoese, who was killed in a March 2024 crash at the intersection of Hall Road and Lincoln Road in Alcoa.

Forsythe, a passenger in a stolen vehicle, was 16 at the time of the crash. The judge ruled he was beyond rehabilitation within the juvenile justice system, citing more than a dozen prior offenses.


The two-day hearing included testimony from mental health experts, a probation officer, and the Tennessee Department of Children's Services (DCS). While Forsythe's attorney and DCS argued he could still be rehabilitated, prosecutors contended he posed a risk to public safety.

Morning Fax Torsythe and another teen, who was driving, were in DCS custody when they escaped, stole a car, and later crashed into Hoese's vehicle while allegedly intoxicated before fleeing the scene.

Hoese's family expressed relief at the ruling. A transfer hearing for the driver is expected at a later date.

Monroe County mother faces charges in 2-year-old daughter's death



A Monroe County grand jury has indicted Sophia Sloan, 26, and five men in connection with the 2023 Sweetwater shooting that killed a toddler. The group faces first-degree murder and aggravated child abuse charges, along with multiple other felonies.

The Feb. 14, 2023 shooting on Hawkins Road resulted in the deaths of young Alayna and Lenning Huerta, who authorities say fired the first shots, striking the child in the head. Huerta was later found dead on the porch from a gunshot wound.

The five men—Nathaniel Kain McEwan, Francisco Lagunas Jr., Liu Huerta, Itzhui Huerta, and Malachi Franklin-are being held criminally responsible for Huerta's actions, according to investigators.

Additional charges include felony murder, conspiracy to commit murder, attempted murder, burglary, reckless endangerment, and firearm possession during a felony.
