
## **Local Student Wins Optimist Club Oratorical Contest**

#### **Etowah Rural Fire Department Receives Grants for Hazardous Materials and Wildland Fire Response**



The Etowah Rural Fire Department has been awarded a \$10,000 grant from Chemtrec and the American Chemistry Council to enhance emergency response capabilities for hazardous material incidents. The department was one of only six agencies in the United States selected for this prestigious award. To qualify, recipients must be members of the National Volunteer Fire Council. A formal recognition included Etowah Rural Fire Chief Adam Hafley, Assistant Fire Chief Kevin Elliott, Joseph Milazzo of Chemtrec, Jeff Sloan of the American Chemistry Council, Tennessee Fire Chief's Association Vice President Melvin Martin, Congressman Chuck Fleischmann's field representative Garrett Frye, McMinn County Mayor John Gentry, and Register of Deeds Cheryl Ingram.

Additionally, the department received a grant from the Tennessee Department of Agriculture Division of Forestry to aid in purchasing equipment for combating grass, woods, and wildland fires. The equipment, valued at approximately \$3,000, will strengthen the department's wildfire response efforts.
