Massive Fire Burns in Monroe County



after 11:00 Shortly am on Tuesday, Monroe March 4, County Dispatch received notification that a fire had been reported on Hwy 360 near Rafter Road. Evacuations were in place and several structures were im-

pacted by the fire. Electricity was temporarily shut off in different parts of Tellico Plains as a precautionary measure against electrical fires in the area. Overnight evacuation Morning Fax shelters were set up at Tellico Plains High Today's News. This Morning. School provided by the American Red Cross. A mobile medical unit was provided by Chota Community Health Services. Over 20 Tri-State Mutual Aid agencies responded to the four separate wildfires that left over 100 acres burning in Monroe County.

Arrest Made in Athens Shooting; Suspect Charged with Attempted Murder



Authorities have arrested a suspect in connection with the February 28 shooting on McMinn Avenue that left one person with life-threatening injuries.

Caleb J. Darby, 30, of Chattanooga, was taken into custody Tuesday morning by federal authorities and Chattanooga Police officers. He was transported back to Athens by detectives with the Athens Police Department and is now facing a charge of attempted

first-degree murder. Darby is being held at the McMinn County Justice Center on a \$450,000 bond.

Athens Police Chief Schultz expressed his gratitude to the federal, state, and local agencies involved in the arrest, including the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms, the Bradley County Sheriff's Office, and the Chattanooga Police Department. He also commended the dedication of the Athens Police Department officers.

The investigation is ongoing, and additional charges are expected. Authorities urge anyone with information to contact the Athens Police Department at 423-744-2730.

Monroe County Public Safety Update


