
ACIS K-Kids to Host "Happy Healthy Kids Fest" on March 29

The winter sports season has pretty much come to an end for Tennessee Wesleyan Ath- Morning Fax letics and the spring season is rolling! Here are the latest updates:

The women's basketball team made a run to the Appalachian Athletic Conference (AAC) Women's Basketball Tournament Championship game. The team, the No. 7 seed, defeated the No. 10 seed, No. 2 seed, and the No. 3 seed on their way to the championship game. In the semifinal win against the No. 3 seed, the team mode a school record 18 three pointers in the victory. The the team made a school record 18 three-pointers in the victory. The team fell in overtime to the No. 1 seed in the championship game.

men's basketball team made it to the quarterfinals of the AAC Men's Basketball Tournament. The team earned the seventh seed in the tournament and defeated the No. 10 seed in their opening round game. The team fell to the No. 2 seed in the tournament. The baseball program has won nine straight games since our last update and is currently on a 10-game win streak. Four of the wins came against teams ranked No. 5 and No. 6 in the NAIA. The team currently has an 18-3 overall record.

The men's tennis team, who remained No. 2 in the latest NAIA poll, won two more matches recently. The team beat Milligan University 7-0 and No. 18 University of the Cumberlands 4- 0.

The women's tennis team, who kept their No. 7 ranking in the most recent NAIA poll, moved their four-match winning streak to six consecutive wins after beating Milligan University and Brenau University by 7-0 scores.

The softball team has begun the season with a 4-2 overall record and a 3-1 record. Two of their four wins have come in extra innings.

The women's lacrosse team won their first game of the season, beating Warner University 10-9 in overtime to give first-year head

coach Lorna Schoemehl her first career win.

The men's lacrosse team also picked up a win recently, beating the University of Michigan Dearborn 13-8.

Men's and women's golf started their spring schedules over the last few weeks.

The men's golf team finished seventh at the 2025 Ram Spring Invite while the women's golf team finished seventh at the Pfeiffer Spring Invitational.

Head baseball coach Billy Berry won his 800th career game as a head coach recently in a walk-off win over Reinhardt University.
