

- The meeting of the City of Athens Board of Zoning Appeals originally scheduled for Wednesday, March 26 has been cancelled, due to not receiving any applications this month.
- The Athens City Council will be meeting in regular session in the Burkett L. Witt Council Chambers of the Athens Municipal Building on Tuesday, March 18 at 6:00 pm. They will be approving equipment purchases, a service agreement with Kimley-Horn & Associates for traffic signal re-timing as well as approving a contract of \$127,800 with the same firm for preliminary design, clearances, and data collection for downtown intersection improvements. 
Fire Destroys Vacant House, Spreads to Camper in Etowah



A vacant house on County Road 804 was completely destroyed by fire early Friday morning around 4 a.m. The flames spread to a camper parked nearby, where the occupant was asleep. He awoke to a popping noise, looked out the window, and saw both the house and camper engulfed in flames.

A neighboring home also sustained heat damage on one side. Multiple agencies responded, including Englewood Rural Fire, Etowah Rural Fire, Claxton Fire, AMR, and EUB. Etowah Rural Fire Chief Adam Hafley and Englewood Rural Fire Chief Billy Roach led the emergency response. Authorities are investigating the cause of the fire.

A very important part of the gas division is the 811 Call Before You Dig location program. AUB crews completed 4,827 request tickets last year. AUB also owns and operates a Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) filling station on Holiday Drive, just off Interstate 75 exit 49.
