Final Mic-Drop for Fellow Radio Broadcaster Randy Sliger



A well known Athens Radio Personality has made his final broadcast. Randall W. "Randy" Sliger passed away at the age of 57 at Starr Regional Medical Center this week, ending a life-long career in Radio Broadcasting. Randy was 11 years old when his father, the late Jim Sliger, constructed and put on the air, WJSQ FM, December 1, 1979. Unknown to most people, Jim Sliger was also the Chief Engineer of numerous radio stations in our area, including WYXI. Jim passed-on many of those highly technical skills and knowledge to Randy, who "took up the mantle" and followed in his father's footsteps.

Over the years Randy and Jim acquired other radio stations; WLAR AM in 1983 and WYGO FM in 1993. They also were the former owners of WCLE FM in Cleveland. Randy was an exceptional individual who had a very big heart and was willing to help anyone at anytime. When tornadoes struck Athens on November 30, 2016 and virtually destroyed the WYXI broadcast facilities, Randy Sliger was the first on the scene to assess the damage and ask "what can I do to help you get back on the air?"

Randy was a kind and decent person and most of all, a very dear friend. He will be deeply missed.

He was preceded in death by his father, Jim Sliger, in 2005 and by his mother, Alma Sliger, in 2016. He is survived by two sisters and brothers-in-law, Melissa Sliger Sutherland and Camden of Athens, and Emilee Sliger Elliott and Steve of Nevada. A funeral service will be held at 7:00 p.m. Sunday, June 8, 2025 at Laycock Hobbs Funeral Home with visitation from 5 to 7 p.m. A graveside service will be held Monday, June 9, 2025 at 11 a.m. at McMinn Memory Gardens. A formal Obituary will be forthcoming.

TWRA's Bobby Wilson Free Fishing Day Returns June 7



The Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency (TWRA) has announced that **Saturday, June 7, 2025**, will be this year's **Bobby Wilson Free Fishing Day**, allowing all Tennessee residents and visitors of any age to fish license-free in public waters across the state.

In addition, youth ages 15 and under can enjoy an entire week of free fishing, from June 7 through Friday, June 13. Established in 1991, Free Fishing Day is part of TWRA's long-running effort to introduce families, children, and first-time anglers to the joys of fishing and outdoor recreation.

Each year, the agency stocks thousands of pounds of fish in waters across the state to help ensure a successful experience for participants. Fishing is permitted on public waters, TWRA lakes, and state park facilities during the free period. Privately owned pay lakes may still charge regular fees, and anglers are encouraged to check with those operators directly.

Athens, DENSO, and TWU Representatives Attend Private Dinner at Japanese Consulate

Representatives from the City of Athens, DENSO, and Tennessee Wesleyan University were recently invited to a private dinner at the Japanese Consulate General Residence in Nashville to celebrate and discuss the longstanding relationship between Japan and McMinn County.

The evening highlighted the deep historical and cultural ties that began in 1881, when Dr. C.S. Long, a missionary from Trinity United Methodist Church in Athens, traveled to Japan and helped found Chinzei Gakuin, a school that remains in operation today.

Discussions also focused on the strong modern-day relationship between McMinn County and its largest employer, DENSO, as well as the shared hope for continued partnership and growth between the community and Japan.

Chattanooga Caregiver Indicted for Exploiting Vulnerable Adult



A Chattanooga caregiver has been indicted and arrested following a Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) probe into the financial exploitation of a vulnerable adult.

Jaliyah Truss, 28, a caregiver with TennCare's CHOICES program, is accused of using a client's bank card to make more than **\$25,000 in unauthorized personal purchases** between August and November 2024. The investigation began in January after a referral from the Department of Disability and Aging, according to the TBI's Medicaid Fraud Control Division.

On **May 28, 2025**, a Hamilton County Grand Jury indicted Truss on **one count each of Financial Exploitation of a Vulnerable Adult, Credit Card Fraud, and Forgery**. She was booked into the **Hamilton County Jail** on **June 3** and released on a **\$40,000 bond**. Authorities emphasized that the charges are merely accusations, and Truss is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty in court. *Source: TBI*
